FPV is a newer concept where solar panels are placed on floats above water bodies. The technologies (floating pontoons and solar PVs) are simple and proven. Compared to land systems, major site preparation is not needed, and installation is easy at sites with low complexity for anchoring/mooring. Generation per module is higher than land systems: the cooling effect of water improves module yields, there is less shading, and there is less dust on the panels reducing the need for cleaning. FPV is cost-competitive, has few financial risks for developers, and can be deployed quickly. As residents of Estes Park and co-owners of the consulting firm Sustainable Water & Energy, my husband and I are familiar with renewable technologies and vested in helping Estes Park succeed in the energy transition. We are happy to talk further about this, and help in other ways as well.
